

If God is for us, who is against us?...Who is to condemn?...Who will separate us from the love of

Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. –Romans 8:31-39

The public theologian Rob Bell inspired me last week when a council member shared a reading from his book What We Talk About When We Talk About God. Bell reminds us that God is for us, and his words echo the Apostle Paul in Romans 8: "If God is for us, who is against us?...Who is to condemn?...Who will separate us from the love of Christ?" God is radically for us, and when God is for us, Paul writes, there is no one and nothing against us. Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ.

It has taken me a long time to learn this lesson, so maybe you don't know it either: God has not set us on a cosmic scale weighing our failures and successes, discerning our worthiness or unworthiness. God is *for* us already. God is in our corner. God has got our back. Instead of constantly testing our faith or trying to outwit us, God is the One coaching us, lifting us up when we're down, carrying us through the most difficult of times. For those of us who have not known this kind of love in our human relationships, it is understandably difficult to comprehend that we need not strive after love but instead simply accept it.

I hope and pray that the Grace community embodies this love for one another. We will inevitably disagree about many and various details of church life and politics and the best way to do things, but at the end of the day, I hope and pray that we are *for* one another. Meaning: I see you. I appreciate you. I love you.

Being *for* one another is tricky. How can we be *for* others when we feel hurt or rejected by them? How can we be *for* others when they are aggressive or hostile?

Each of us have been hurt in our lives. Each of us have limitations. Each of us have insecurities. How we interact with people is often a measure of our own emotional health, not an indication of how we feel about the other person or the situation. When we feel at peace within ourselves, when we know that we are loved, we will likely respond to other people with kindness, compassion, and understanding. When we feel stressed or anxious or scared, we may respond to other people with hostility or suspicion—even if the person or situation does not warrant such a response.

Recently, a friend told me a story about his neighbor who, in response to an invitation to a neighborhood gathering, got angry and told him never to contact her again. Confused by the hostility of his neighbor, my friend wondered: Why get mad about an invitation to a neighborhood gathering? Ironically, the neighbor's response angered my friend; he told me this story twice over the course of two weeks. He clearly had not gotten over it. What did I do wrong? my friend wondered aloud to me. Now, I don't know this neighbor, but I suggested the neighbor was having a bad day and that my friend should in no way take offense.

Being *for* one another means that we treat one another with compassion, considering that we might not have the full story when someone responds to us in a manner that seems unwarranted. Being *for* one another involves taking good care of ourselves and increasing our own self-awareness about our triggers and stressors so that we don't inappropriately lash out on those who are just trying to be good neighbors or church family.

God is *for* us. As the body of Christ, may we be *for* one another: seeing, appreciating, and loving one another even when we may mistakes and get flummoxed by our insecurities. Because God is *for* us, we can rest assured that we are seen, appreciated, and loved by God—just as we are.

The Grand Canyon Synod & L'Eglise Lutherienne du Senegal





Why?

To grow the relationship between the Grand Canyon Synod (GCS) and the L'Eglise Lutherienne du Senegal (ELS), our companion church in West Africa!. We are committed to walking alongside each other as siblings in faith.

What?

The Grand Canyon Synod will host 5 young adults from Senegal
January 10-21. We will share about our culture, our church, our community and our
faith. Then in July, 5 young adults from the GCS will visit the ELS in Senegal and be
immerses in culture, the church, communities, and faith.

Who?

Young Adults in our synod ages 18-35 who have a desire to deepen faith, learn about the Senegalese culture, and grow in understanding of the global church relationship.

When?

Young Adults from Senegal will be in the US in January 10-21 and the young adults from American will go to Senegal in July (dates to be determined based on airfare prices).

Cost?

The trip is expected to cost \$2000 per person. The Synod will provide \$500 towards airfare for each participant. Host families/communities will provide housing, most meals, and local transportation.

Partnership with All Saints Lutheran Church

Grace has partnered with All Saints Lutheran Church in north Phoenix since at least 2012. Each synod of the ELCA is broken up into smaller conferences, and Grace and All Saints belong to the same Capital Conference. Congregations in the same conference come together for periodic synodical meetings, and the WELCA groups from the conference work together on programs. In addition, the pastors from the conference meet on a monthly basis in order to share resources, ideas, and support, so we have partnered with All Saints in the various ways that the conference has worked together. Specifically, youth from All Saints joined Grace youth for a number of years when we put together Christmas gift bags for pancake breakfast guests. All Saints' confirmation class traditionally attends our contemporary worship service once a year to expose their youth to a different form of worship (All Saints only worships in a traditional format). All Saints participates in Campfirmation just as Grace does. The past couple years, the men's group from All Saints has come to serve the pancake breakfast. For three weeks this past summer, the food pantry at All Saints donated their leftover produce and meat to us for our heat respite program. As well, All Saints provides generous financial support for heat respite each summer. Grace claims a unique connection to All Saints. While in seminary, Pastor Shari Bernau served as a pastoral intern here; GLOW is her legacy as she began the program as her internship project. After Pastor Shari graduated from seminary, she went to serve All Saints for 10 years as associate pastor. For all these various reasons, we give thanks to God for All Saint's partnership!

Tithe.ly: A New Online Giving Option

The ELCA has reached a preferred vendor agreement with Tithe.ly, a company that offers online tools to enhance financial giving to ELCA congregation and ministries. Through Tithe.ly, donation forms are integrated into the congregation's website instead of sending donors to third-party sites. Donors have the option to make one-time or recurring gifts to provide more consistent giving.
